

## Hazardous Waste

The Township of Perry attempts to schedule one day every second year where residents can drop off their 'Household Hazardous Waste', free of charge.

Materials that may be dropped off on Hazardous Waste Day include:

Latex and oil paints  
Motor oils and lubricants  
Cleaners such as bleach, oven cleaners  
Solvents such as varsol, paint thinners  
Pool and photographic chemicals  
Pesticides and herbicides  
Pharmaceuticals  
Fluorescent lighting bulbs  
Light Fuels  
Car batteries



The Township if not permitted to store hazardous waste on-site and can therefore not accept these materials at any other time.



### WHY RECYCLE?

Recycling saves energy and resources and reduces greenhouse gas emissions.

Recycling will prolong the life of the Rain Lake Landfill Site.

### DID YOU KNOW?

Recycling just one aluminum can saves enough energy to run a TV for three hours, or about 2 litres of gasoline.

Each tonne of paper that gets recycled saves 17 trees, 1500 litres of oil, 3 cubic metres of landfill space and 26,000 litres of water.

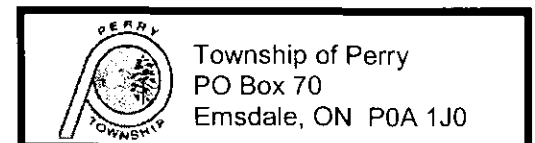

### Background

Township of Perry By-law #2002-06 governs the disposal of refuse in the Township, as well as the mandatory requirement to recycle certain materials. The Township is responsible for administering the Transfer Station/Recycling Centre at 775 Highway #592, while the Kearney-Perry Joint Waste Management Board is responsible for administering the Rain Lake Landfill Site and setting rules and regulations related to the disposal of waste and refuse (not recyclable materials). The Rain Lake Landfill Site, located on Rain Lake Road in the Town of Kearney, is the final destination for all of the non-recyclable waste and refuse coming from the Township of Perry and the Town of Kearney Transfer Stations.



## Disposal Procedures

It is illegal to dispose of any type of waste or refuse on a road or highway (travelled or untravelled portions), or on public or Township land (except the Transfer Station/Recycling Centre), including at the gates of the Transfer Station/Recycling Centre when it is not open. Disposal of waste or refuse on private land is only permitted through authorization from the Ontario Ministry of the Environment.

All residents using the Township of Perry Transfer Station/Recycling Centre are required to sort and place each type of refuse in particular areas as directed by Site Attendants and signs. Only refuse generated inside the Township of Perry is permitted to be disposed of at the Transfer Station/ Recycling Centre.

## Refuse Disposal Card

Each household in the Township of Perry is entitled to receive a 'refuse disposal card', through which the household is permitted to dispose of an allotted 5 bags of refuse per month. A charge of \$2.00 for each bag to be disposed of over and above the 5 bag limit shall apply. A bag of refuse can be no larger than 26" by 36". Carry over of bags from one month to another is **not** permitted (bags must be used within the allotted month on the disposal card).

## Recycling

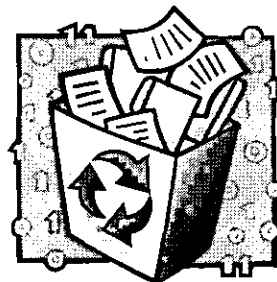
Recycling is mandatory; not an option. Site Attendants are permitted to check bags of refuse, prior to disposal by a resident, to ensure compliance with this provision. There is no cost and no volume limits involved in recycling household recyclable products. Household recyclable products are to be sorted into two categories:

### **1) Containers - All Metals, Plastics, Glass and Styrofoam Products:**

Aluminum and steel cans  
Aluminum trays and foil  
Rigid plastic containers (HDPE)  
Plastic soft drink bottles (PET)  
Plastic bags / film wrap  
Clear and coloured glass  
**Clean styrofoam** trays / containers

### **2) Fibres - All Paper Products:**

Newspaper Catalogues  
Cardboard Mixed paper  
Phone books Brown paper bags  
Magazines Flyers  
Boxboard Office (fine) paper  
Egg Cartons Wax coated milk /  
juice containers



## Large Disposal Items

The following items may be disposed of at the Transfer Station:

Large appliances and water tanks  
Appliances containing freon  
Scrap metal  
Tires  
Ashphalt shingles  
Furniture  
20 lb propane tanks  
Building materials / building debris to be burned

Extra charges apply for these materials, and must be paid for at the time of disposal. Please see a Site Attendant for a list of fees associated with these materials.

## Penalty and Enforcement

Residents who do not comply with the disposal procedures and other rules and regulations at the Transfer Station/Recycling Centre can have their privileges to use the site removed for up to 7 days by a site attendant.

Residents who repeatedly do not comply with the disposal procedures and other rules and regulations, and/or commit more serious infractions, shall be guilty of an offense and punishable upon conviction under the Provincial Offenses Act by a fine of not more than \$5,000.
